Memorization is NOT required but is strongly encouraged at least for practice. These will be solo performances, without accompaniment. Students will perform for judges in private. This is not a public performance event, although the music can be heard from a short distance away.

Cash prizes will be awarded (see the list below). Winning fiddlers will be announced on the evening of the Competition by email. The winning fiddlers will also be publicized. All participants will receive award or participation certificates.

Grade levels are those as of October 2025.

Grade Categories	Required Pieces to Perform	Cash Awards*
Grades 3, 4 and 5	Skye Boat Song Set (waltz, jig, reel)	First: \$200 Second: \$100 Third: \$50
Grades 6, 7 and 8	Cathkin Braes Set (strathspey, jig, 2 reels)	First: \$300 Second: \$150 Third: \$75
Grades 9 and 10	Banks of Spey Set (strathspey, jig, 2 reels)	First: \$400 Second: \$200 Third: \$100
Grades 11 and 12	Hurricane Set (barn dance, strathspey, reel)	First: \$500 Second: 300 Third: \$200

\*NOTE: "Honorable Mention" designations are also possible.

Memorization is NOT required but is strongly encouraged at least for practice. Accompaniment is not required nor allowed. Students will perform for judges in private. This is *not* a public performance event, although the music can be heard from a short distance away. The judges' decisions are final. The judging forms they use to make work notes will *not* be shared with the students, parents, or private teachers. Blank judging forms, however, are available upon request.

Scottish fiddling, even to untrained ears, can be distinguished from other Celtic and Folk fiddling styles by its particular precision of execution and energetic delivery. The style has a very large repertoire consisting of a great variation of styles, rhythms and keys, arguably more than in related styles such as Irish fiddle music. Alan Watson of The Scottish Fiddle Society in Scotland tells us that there are over 12,000 published Scottish fiddle tunes. Scottish fiddle music is popular all over the world and has many talented exponents performing the wide variety of regional styles.
